Councillor Gandara asked is this transitional or permanent and are we giving additional funding?

Jan Lauterbach said the change is for permanent for 18 years and older. I believe they applied for CDBG funds.

Councillor Gandara asked how much was it?

Brian Kavanagh, CEO of FYI said it was around \$27,000.

Councillor Gandara asked what kind of life skills are you providing?

Brian Kavanagh said the youth take a life skills assessment where we develop an individualized?

Councillor Gandara asked what other partners do you collaborate with?

Brian Kavanagh said Community of Hope, VA Office, St. Luke's

Councillor Gandara asked do the youth have a high school diploma?

Monique Lopez said we work with Nancy at the public schools to identify any youth who need housing. She provides referrals and we assess whether they fit the criteria.

Councillor Pedroza said I would appreciate a presentation on this.

Mayor Miyagishima said I think you've prepared them well.

Representative Jeff Steinborn said the state is behind this. We would be the first city in New Mexico to have an official Rio Grande Trail adjoining our City. Trails are huge economic development.

Councillor Sorg said this is also public health.

Peter Livingstone, Member of the Public said I'm on the Board of Directors of the Southern New Mexico Trail Alliance. Our mission is to coordinate these groups for support of ideas like this. It's a great economic opportunity.

Councillor Eakman said I prefer Plaza Las Cruces or Plaza de Las Cruces as it is about the entire City and not just the Downtown.

Councillor Gandara said St. Genevieve's Plaza or Plaza de Las Cruces.

Councillor Sorg said I would go with Plaza de Las Cruces.

Councillor Levatino said Downtown Plaza.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said I would go with Plaza de Las Cruces as it's simple and appropriate to our history.

Mayor Miyagishima said I'll throw out Amistad Plaza in honor of Dan Sosa.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Amend Resolution No. 17-019 to name the plaza Plaza de Las Cruces and Councillor Sorg Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Amend Resolution No. 17-019 to name the plaza Plaza de Las Cruces and it was Approved. 5-2. Councillor Gandara, Councillor Eakman, Councillor Sorg, Councillor Levatino, and Mayor Pro-Tem Smith voted Aye. Councillor Pedroza and Mayor Miyagishima voted Nay.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-019 as amended and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

Amy Johnson Bassford, Grants and Contract Compliance Specialist gave an overhead presentation.

Councillor Pedroza asked is there a plan to have any kind of medians?

Amy Johnson Bassford said the project does include medians on Amador and Melendres.

Jerry Cordova, Civil Engineer Sr. said we are putting medians on all four legs of the intersection.

Amy Johnson Bassford continued with her overhead presentation.

Councillor Levatino said I'm concerned about the Plaza being a heat island. What was used to get the projections?

Lisa LaRocque, Sustainability Officer said there are several different climatic models that are used and fed into a computer system. The two major trends are a low scenario trend and a high scenario trend.

Councillor Levatino said I'm concerned that these projections have no basis.

Mayor Miyagishima said I think we need to look into cooling centers.

Councillor Levatino asked does this require us to match funds?

David Dollahon, Interim City Manager said there is no requirement to match funds. We have five designated facilities as cooling/warming stations.

Councillor Gandara said we should start talking now about plans for next year in a work session.

Donna O'Daniel, Member of the Public said there is evidence that the climate models are not backed by scientific evidence.

Mayor Miyagishima called for roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-037 and it was Approved. 6-1. Councillor Gandara, Councillor Pedroza, Councillor Eakman, Councillor Sorg, Mayor Pro-Tem Smith, and Mayor Miyagishima voted Aye. Councillor Levatino voted Nay.

(13) Resolution No.17-038: A Resolution Authorizing the Interim City Manager to Sign a Letter of Support for the Doña Ana Arts Council's (DAAC) and City of Las Cruces' Application for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) FY17 "Our Town" Grant in the Amount of \$50,000.00; and to Obligate the Cash Match Amount of \$11,000.00 in the FY18 City Budget.

Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-038 and Councillor Gandara Seconded the motion.

Amy Johnson Bassford, Grants and Contract Compliance Specialist gave an overhead presentation.

Councillor Eakman asked who is the fiduciary on this grant?

Amy Johnson Bassford said it will be submitted by the Doña Ana County Arts Council and they will be the fiscal agent.

Councillor Eakman asked is there any liability on the City's part?

Amy Johnson Bassford said the Doña Ana Arts Council will take responsibility for the funds with liability language to cover the City if there is a problem with the grant we would get the funds back.

David Dollahon said this is just authorizing us for an application. There's no guarantee of funding.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-038 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

(14) Resolution No.17-039: A Resolution Approving a Special Use Permit Application to Construct a New Wireless Communication Facility on a Property Located at 2499 El Camino Real. The Subject Property Encompasses 6.61± Acres and is Zoned M-1/M-2C (Industrial Standard-Conditional). Submitted by Wireless Resources, Inc./Central State Tower Behalf of Fiesta Properties, LLC, Property Owner (67384).

Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-039 and Councillor Pedroza Seconded the motion.

Adam Ochoa, Planner gave an overhead presentation.

Mayor Miyagishima asked is this for a particular company?

Adam Ochoa said it is for Verizon Wireless.

Councillor Eakman asked did you send out letters to the surrounding properties?

Adam Ochoa said yes.

Councillor Eakman asked did you only receive one response?

Adam Ochoa said yes.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith asked how would the surrounding properties have first heard about this?

Adam Ochoa said the same amount of letters was sent out for the P&Z meeting and this Council meeting along with a sign located on the property. We also advertised in the Las Cruces Sun News.

Mayor Miyagishima asked do we not send certified mail anymore?

Adam Ochoa said we are required to send out certified mail within 200 feet of the property.

Councillor Pedroza asked what makes it the best available site?

Adam Ochoa said it's is rather technical and that's why we hired a consultant. This is the only industrially zoned area.

Councillor Pedroza asked are there any required setbacks between the residential and this type of communication facility?

Adam Ochoa said a tower is required to meet a one foot setback for each foot in height from any adjacent residential property plus 10%.

Councillor Gandara asked who gets certified mail and who doesn't?

Adam Ochoa said we send out certified mail outs for all adjacent property within 100 feet minus adjacent right-of-way. We send out regular mail outs to property owners within 500 feet.

Councillor Gandara asked would there be a consideration to disguising the tower?

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said there is nothing around the tower to help mask it so probably clean and simple would be best.

Councillor Pedroza asked would the tower decrease the value of property?

Adam Ochoa said we haven't seen any evidence showing that would happen but we have no data.

David Weir said the City doesn't establish property values. The property is already zoned industrial so it allows telecommunications towers to be placed in it.

Councillor Eakman asked is this a tower for future expansion?

Mike Gallagher, Wireless Resources said Verizon Wireless is proposing to use 60 feet and leaving two additional spaces above them.

Councillor Eakman asked is the tower owned by a third party?

Mike Gallagher said it will be owned by CST and Verizon Wireless will be the tenant.

Councillor Sorg asked would the applicant be opposed to concealing this tower?

Mike Gallagher said we did look into those options but it became a safety issue because the tower is taking over an existing unit.

Councillor Sorg asked can you explain the taking over part?

Mike Gallagher said there's an existing unit there now.

He said the FY17 budget was approved by the Department of Finance and Administration.

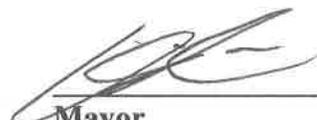
