I. OPENING CEREMONIES

Mayor Miyagishima called the meeting to order. Mayor Pro-Tem Smith lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Jennifer Martinez from PIO presented the Pet of the Week.

Mayor Miyagishima presented the Mayor's Distinguished Service Award to Jack Nixon.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith and Councillor Eakman presented a Proclamation to McKlean Knight and declared Monday, August 15, 2016, as McKlean Knight Day.

Councillor Sorg Moved to Suspend the rules and discuss items 8 and 9 concurrently and Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Suspend the rules and discuss items 8 and 9 concurrently and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

Monica Campbell, Office Manager Senior in the Legal Department gave verbal presentation.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-023 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

(9) Resolution No.17-024: A Resolution Authorizing Halo's to Continue with the Permitting Process to Allow for the Sale and Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages within Two Restricted and Secured Areas at the Big Event to be Held September 23, 24, and 25, 2016 at the Civic Plaza Between East Las Cruces Avenue and East Organ Avenue.

Councillor Eakman Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-024 and Councillor Sorg Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-024 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

(10) Resolution No.17-025: A Resolution Authorizing the City of Las Cruces to Designate a Voting Delegate and an Alternate to Attend the Annual Business Meeting of the 59th Annual Conference of the New Mexico Municipal League on Thursday, September 1, 2016.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-025 and Councillor Sorg Seconded the motion.

Councillor Levatino Moved to Amend Resolution No. 17-025 appointing Councillor Smith as the designated voting delegate with no alternate and Councillor Sorg Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Amend Resolution No. 17-025 appointing Councillor Smith as the designated voting delegate with no alternate and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-025 as amended and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

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- (11) Resolution No.17-026: A Resolution Approving a Street Name Change for a Segment of Tashiro Dr. Between N. Valley Dr. And Motel Blvd. to the Name of Jim Bradley Dr.

Councillor Eakman Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-026 and Councillor Levatino Seconded the motion.

Katherine Harrison-Rogers, Acting Building & Development Services Administrator gave an overhead presentation.

Mayor Miyagishima said I think the world of Jim Bradley but the Tashiro family has owned this land throughout their lifetime and whoever bought the land from them probably made an arrangement to keep it named that. I will not be supportive of this because this is the only Japanese name in the entire City. It would make more sense to change Bruins Lane.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said the Tashiro name is well known and it is part of our culture so I think it is somewhat disrespectful. I think we should look at Motel Boulevard or Roadrunner.

Councillor Pedroza said I'm not going to vote for this because it will erase some history. We have other streets available.

Councillor Sorg said I think it is a good idea to name a street after Coach Bradley but not Tashiro Drive. Motel Boulevard or Bruins Lane is fine with me.

Councillor Eakman said I agree that if we change the name it should be continuous. I would ask for us to table this to another time so those in Legends West can voice their opinion.

Councillor Gandara said I was at the school board meeting when they discussed this and there was some opposition from the student representative because all the high schools play at the stadium. I think we need to see what was done to check with the other schools. I like the idea of changing Motel Boulevard but there are businesses there. I'd like to see this tabled.

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said one option that was discussed was naming the private access way within the Field of Dreams but that would be a private decision on the school board's part.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said we do have two Roadrunners in Las Cruces.

Councillor Pedroza said I don't think it's our call to pick the street.

Councillor Levatino asked are there any members of the Tashiro family still in Las Cruces?

Mayor Miyagishima said I'm not aware of any.

Councillor Levatino said so we don't know if they would be opposed to this or not.

Mayor Miyagishima said I would be willing to venture that they would prefer not.

Councillor Levatino said I'm always opposed to naming roads after people because someone's feelings are always hurt. I like the idea of naming Bruins Drive. I would like to see the name split so one side is Bradley and the other Tashiro. I can't see changing Motel Boulevard because of the businesses.

Jimmy Michael said there were some schools who objected to the naming but that was when we were trying to name the field itself so Stan Rounds and Robert Garza suggested the street. I spoke to some of the family members who have no objection to the naming.

Mayor Miyagishima asked what do you think of Bruins Lane or Roadrunner Lane?

Jimmy Michael said we would have to talk to the other people involved. We wanted to name the turf at the field but that drew resistance.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-026 and it Failed. 0-6-1. Councillor Gandara, Councillor Pedroza, Councillor Eakman, Councillor Sorg, Mayor Pro-Tem Smith and Mayor Miyagishima voted Nay. Councillor Levatino Abstained.

(12) Resolution No.17-027: A Resolution Adopting the City of Las Cruces (City) Sponsored Events from the City's General Fund for the Application Award Period of July 15, 2016.

Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-027 and Councillor Gandara Seconded the motion.

David Dollahon, Assistant City Manager gave an overhead presentation.

Mayor Miyagishima asked can you expand on the Tough Enough to Wear Pink?

David Dollahon said we received additional information throughout the application process that required us to reconsider our initial decision. We're bringing it forward as a separate resolution rather than amending this one at the last minute.

Mayor Miyagishima asked did NMSU basketball apply?

David Dollahon said part of the application was submitted incomplete and there's opportunity for them to seek submittal at the December deadline.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith asked do we have an informal understanding that we're splitting the funds in half?

David Dollahon said there was no formal decision made. The staff discussed that we should try to do a 50/50 split. It just worked out that way.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith asked did they request the amounts that they're getting?

David Dollahon said they are getting what they requested with \$6000 as our cap.

Councillor Pedroza asked would it be appropriate to know who else may have applied?

David Dollahon said I will provide you with an email or memo outlining who applied, who was awarded funding and who was denied.

Councillor Gandara asked what are the performance outcomes of each event?

David Dollahon said we can include that on the memo. They get operating expenses and we get naming rights and recognition.

Mayor Miyagishima asked is some of this from CVB?

David Dollahon said this is from the general fund for quality of life and economic development.

Yoli Diaz, Executive Director of CARE said when I submitted my application I did ask for more and I would like to ask for the max of \$6000.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-027 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-028 and Councillor Sorg Seconded the motion.

David Dollahon, Assistant City Manager gave an overhead presentation.

Amy Johnson Bassford, Grants and Contract Compliance Specialist continued with the overhead presentation.

Councillor Pedroza asked is there an adult daycare?

David Dollahon said there are privately funded senior day cares.

Henry Magallanez, Member of the Public asked if you remove it from the consent agenda, will all the grants be removed or just that one item?

David Dollahon said all the grants would be available for discussion.

Henry Magallanez asked will you be combining similar grants?

David Dollahon said it will be any type of grant.

Kimberly York, Director of NCH Family Outreach said we support the Grandparents as Parents and are allocating to provide in home support.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-028 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

- (14) Resolution No.17-029: A Resolution Approving a Waiver from 100% of the Required Road Improvements to Aldrich Road and Wilt Avenue Associated with a Proposed Subdivision Known as East Miller Tracts Subdivision on a 4.294± Acre Parcel Located at 6501 Aldrich

Road. Submitted by Moy Surveying, Inc. on Behalf of Steve Miller, Property Owner (66370W).

Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Resolution No. 17-029 and Councillor Gandara Seconded the motion.

Katherine Harrison-Rogers, Acting Building & Development Services Administrator gave an overhead presentation.

Councillor Eakman asked I was wondering the reasons for the fee in lieu of road improvements?

Daniel Avila, Interim City Manager said in this subdivision they are providing right-of-way so in lieu of the fee we are looking for dedication because it is significant.

Councillor Eakman asked how much would a third of an acre be worth?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said my guess is \$20,000.

Councillor Levatino said in that area a quarter of an acre is selling between \$20,000 to \$25,000.

Councillor Pedroza asked would no improvements be built or would the City do the improvements?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said only the right-of-way would be given. There would be no improvements built out. The City already has it on their schedule to do improvements to that road.

Councillor Pedroza asked if the owners put in the improvements, is that the same as dedicating the road?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said if they don't devote they would have to recoup the costs.

Councillor Sorg asked do you know the type of work that will be done on Aldrich Road?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said I believe it's just a surfacing treatment.

Loretta Reyes said it will be a crack seal, chip seal, and micro surfacing.

Councillor Gandara asked why was a waiver given to Porter?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said it was low density and family. The roadways surrounding the properties had some improvements.

Councillor Gandara asked is this for estate planning?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said it is for when they are preparing the will they can give it to various family members.

Councillor Levatino asked are the other parcels smaller than this one?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said this is double the size of the others that were granted a waiver.

Councillor Levatino asked is there any reason why access to that property would go onto Jefferson?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said in theory you could do that. We like to see properties access off of local roads.

Councillor Levatino said many don't want road improvements. I would support a waiver.

Councillor Gandara asked was the phone call from the Browns?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said it was in addition to the Browns.

Councillor Pedroza asked if they decided to put in more homes would they be required to fix the roads?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said yes.

Councillor Pedroza asked how would the uniform development code effect our decision today?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said a full subdivision requires road improvements.

Henry Magallanez, Moy Survey said the access will be from Jefferson and Aldrich. There are curb cuts already made.

Councillor Eakman asked why do you feel like taxpayers should be paying for the curb and gutters?

Henry Magallanez said I think taxpayers should be paying for road improvements regardless of where it is. It's a burden for these two lot splits.

Councillor Eakman said I would like to see us become one City with our codes.

Mayor Miyagishima asked why couldn't we have an amount that we would need to have it done properly and then have a lien on it that would be enacted when other family members try to sell it?

Rusty Babington, City Attorney said you could create an ordinance but you would need the community developers and public works for accurate estimates.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 17-029 and it was Approved. 6-1. Councillor Gandara, Councillor Pedroza, Councillor Sorg, Councillor Levatino, Councillor Smith and Mayor Miyagishima voted Aye. Councillor Eakman voted Nay.

Councillor Pedroza said I'm sure people will want to know what the City gets out of this.

Mayor Miyagishima said it's an incentive to bring in businesses to this area and expand their operations to add more jobs.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Amend Ordinance No. 2788 to delete any reference of the City entering into a covenant agreement and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Ordinance No. 2788 as amended and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.
