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**I. OPENING CEREMONIES**

Mayor Miyagishima called the meeting to order. Mayor Miyagishima led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Jennifer Martinez from PIO presented the Pet of the Week.

Mayor Miyagishima presented a Proclamation to Las Esperanzas and declared Saturday, June 4, 2016, as Zoot Suit Pachanga Day.

Chief Travis Brown introduced the new Fire Chief Eric Enriquez.

**II. CONFLICT OF INTEREST INQUIRY BY MAYOR AS REQUIRED BY LCMC SECTION 2-27(E)(2).** *At the opening of each council meeting, the chairperson shall ask if any member of the city council, city manager, or any member of the city staff has any known conflict of interest with any item on the agenda.*

Mayor Miyagishima asked if anyone had any conflicts with anything on the agenda?

There was none.

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### **III. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

John Hamilton, Member of the Public said I suffer from Parkinson's disease. In 2012, a group of us asked the state to review the scientific nature of linking exposure to pesticides and Parkinson's. Their conclusion was out of 60 reviewed, 35 demonstrated an association between the two. I would like this discussed in a work session. We will be having a discussion at the county on June 1, 2016.

Richard Fagerlund, Member of the Public said the pesticides they are spraying around buildings are not safe and they are doing it wrong.

Lisa Willman, Member of the Public said I would like for the City Council to reconsider taking out the medians on Missouri because they are there for safety. I also hope you reconsider widening Telshor. We're also hosting a bicycle ride on Saturday morning.

Donna O'Daniel, Member of the Public said I'm the Chairman of the Las Cruces Support Your Local Police Committee. She read a statement.

Dolores Connor, Member of the Public said I'm here to give you an update on the Election Advisory Council. We had 1000 early voters last week. I want to thank you for the City Beat. I also want to say farewell and congratulate Mr. Garza on a job well done.

Vincent Jeffers, Member of the Public said I asked for my medical record and did not receive it. We need someone to audit this.

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**VIII. RESOLUTION(S) AND/OR ORDINANCE(S) FOR DISCUSSION**

- (9) Resolution No.16-222: A Resolution Adopting a New Utility Rate Setting Process Recommended for Approval by the Las Cruces Utilities Board of Commissioners.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Approve Resolution No. 16-222 and Councillor Sorg Seconded the motion.

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Councillor Sorg Moved to suspend the rules to discuss items 9, 10, and 11 concurrently and Councillor Eakman Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to suspend the rules to discuss items 9, 10 and 11 concurrently and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

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Dr. Jorge Garcia, Utilities Director gave an overhead presentation.

Councillor Pedroza asked does it say City Council will approve or not?

Dr. Jorge Garcia said I didn't mean to imply that we would always approve. You will apply policy direction to the utility board and it would be by ordinance. The procedure has not changed.

Mayor Miyagishima said before the board would improve the raise in rates whereas now it's the City Council.

Councillor Sorg said this is a widely used process in many cities. The RAC didn't like the way we were doing it before and encouraged us to go in this direction.

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Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-222 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0

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- (10) Resolution No.16-223: A Resolution Repealing Resolution No. 09-170 Establishing an Ad Hoc Board to be Known as The Ratepayer Advisory Committee, and Approving the Appellate Portions of the Utility Rate Making Procedures Previously Approved by the Las Cruces Utilities Board of Commissioners.

Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Resolution No. 16-223 and Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-223 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

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- (11) Resolution No.16-224: A Resolution Approving the Third Amended By-Laws of the Board of Commissioners for the City of Las Cruces Utilities.

Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Councillor Eakman Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-224 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0

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- (12) Resolution No.16-225: A Resolution Approving Updates to the Public Safety Development Impact Fees and the Public Safety Development Impact Fee Capital Improvement Plan, with an Effective Date of July 1, 2016.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Approve Resolution No. 16-225 and Councillor Eakman Seconded the motion.

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Chief Travis Brown gave an overhead presentation.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith asked have we heard if this is going to negatively impact anyone?

Chief Travis Brown said we have had close to 30 public meetings and we haven't had much participation by any of the stakeholders.

Councillor Eakman asked what is the effect of demand on new construction?

Chief Travis Brown said that was discussed at great length many times but we were unable to come up with something that could provide that.

Mayor Miyagishima said in 2001 the voters voted to increase gross receipts tax to go into increasing salaries at the police department.

Councillor Levatino asked what was the rationale for not keeping fees uniform?

Chief Travis Brown said there is a higher number of people living in larger homes so in theory they're going to require more service over time and there's more people to serve.

Councillor Levatino asked did you say there was a safety net so developers don't have to pay twice?

Chief Travis Brown said part of the state law says you can't charge new development twice for an improvement so credit is given.

Councillor Levatino said my preference is to keep the fees where they are for a little longer.

Councillor Pedroza said impact fees used to be a contentious topic. I think the increase is money well spent for safety.

Councillor Sorg asked do other cities use GO Bonds to buy these pieces of infrastructure?

Chief Travis Brown said I can't tell you definitively.

Robert Garza, City Manager said the use of GO Bonds for public safety is not new to our City.

Councillor Sorg asked can affordable housing have fees waived?

Chief Travis Brown said it is an exception but that fee still has to be paid and is generally paid by our CBG funds.

Councillor Sorg has the ICIP approved this impact fee?

Chief Travis Brown said they make a recommendation for approval by City Council.

Mayor Miyagishima asked can the fees be updated every five years?

Chief Travis Brown said the law requires it no more than every five years.

Mayor Miyagishima asked are we at five years right now?

Chief Travis Brown said August 1<sup>st</sup> is the deadline.

Steve Montanez, Member of the Public said it's my recommendation that further research is done as far as the City's growth rate. How are the fees implemented for multi units?

Chief Travis Brown said multifamily would be addressed based on each dwelling unit and the size of the dwelling unit.

Mayor Miyagishima said this is only applicable to new construction.

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Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-225 and it was Approved. 6-1. Councillor Gandara, Councillor Pedroza, Councillor Eakman, Councillor Sorg, Councillor Smith and Mayor Miyagishima voted aye. Councillor Levatino voted nay.

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(13) Resolution No.16-226: A Resolution Appointing an Interim City Manager.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Approve Resolution No. 16-226 and Councillor Eakman Seconded the motion.

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Robert Garza said my last day is Friday, May 27<sup>th</sup> so we have put together a resolution to appoint Assistant City Manager Daniel Avila as the interim City Manager for a 90 day period to be extended for up to six months.

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Councillor Eakman Moved to Amend Resolution No. 16-226 to omit "tenue" from the resolution and Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Amend Resolution No. 16-226 to omit "tenue" from the resolution and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

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Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-226 as amended and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

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- (14) Resolution No.16-227: A Resolution Awarding Funding to El Caldito Soup Kitchen for the Provision of Public Services for FY 2017 and Authorizing the Assistant City Manager to Execute the Purchased Services Agreement on Behalf of the City of Las Cruces.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Approve Resolution no. 16-227 and Councillor Sorg Seconded the motion.

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David Weir, Community Development Director gave an overhead presentation.

Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said the fund is set up to help various organizations and we need to look at how to support them appropriately.

David Weir said there is a work session scheduled for more information.

Councillor Levatino said my concern is the fairness.

Councillor Sorg said we need to rethink how to use this valuable asset.

Councillor Gandara said I think we need to work together to service the population like we need to.

Gabe Anaya, President of the Board of Directors for El Caldito said thank you for your reconsideration.

Dolores Archuleta, Member of the Public said not a lot of people know about the Telshor Facility Fund so you may want to explain where that money is coming from.

Mayor Miyagishima said we leased the building and got half of \$45 million. Whatever interest we get on it, half we keep and half we use to give to Health and Human Services.

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Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-227 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0

Mayor Miyagishima appointed Abel Chavarria to the Senior Programs Advisory Board.

Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Mayor Miyagishima's board appointment of Abel Chavarria to the Senior Programs Advisory Board and Councillor Levatino Seconded the motion.

Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Mayor Miyagishima's board appointment of Abel Chavarria to the Senior Programs Advisory Board and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

(15) Council Bill No. 16-023; Ordinance No. 2782: An Ordinance Approving a Zone Change from C-1 (Commercial Low Intensity) to C-1/R-2 (Commercial Low Intensity/Multi-Dwelling Low Density) for a 0.29± Acre Parcel Located at 3899 Nemesh Drive. Submitted by Mark Stuve, Property Owner (62718).

Councillor Sorg asked does the change mean that the property owner could put either a high impact residency or commercial?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said they would be able to put in some commercial use in addition to a low density multi dwelling residential unit.

Councillor Sorg asked can it be in separate buildings or the same building?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said either way but the lot is small so you're limited.

Councillor Sorg asked can it be two story?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said it could.

Mayor Miyagishima asked could you give us some examples of what it could be?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said it could be a quadriplex or triplex, a small café, a five and dime.

Mayor Miyagishima asked does the applicant have to disclose what they're doing there?

Katherine Harrison-Rogers said not at this time but they do have plans for multifamily.

Mayor and Council agreed to bring back.

a.) Mayor

She said tomorrow at the Rio Grande Theater they will be showing a film called "I Am Me" about gender, sexuality and identity.

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Daniel Avila, Assistant City Manager said Robert Garza has a great reputation and is very honest. I appreciate all the mentoring he has given me.
