AN ORDINANCE AMENDING LAS CRUCES MUNICIPAL CODE, SECTION 27-12-6-17, PARKING RESTRICTIONS FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLES, TO ESTABLISH A LINEAR LIMIT BEYOND WHICH RECREATIONAL VEHICLES MAY NOT BE PARKED AT THE SIDE OF A RESIDENCE, TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF DAYS A PERSON MAY RESIDE IN A RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKED AT A RESIDENCE, TO REDUCE THE NUMBER OF DAYS A RECREATIONAL VEHICLE MAY BE PARKED ON A STREET OR ALLEY; AND TO CLARIFY THE AUTHORITY OF CODES ENFORCEMENT TO ENFORCE THIS ORDINANCE AND SECTION 27-12-6-18, OCCUPATION OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLE; AND TO MAKE BOTH ORDINANCES CONSISTENT WITH LAS CRUCES DEVELOPMENT CODE, SECTION 38-57, MOBILE HOME PARKS/RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKS.

BACKGROUND / KEY ISSUES / CONTRIBUTING FACTORS: Pursuant to a request from the Mayor, staff has drafted this ordinance which modifies two ordinances which address the parking and occupation of recreational vehicles in residential areas.

The two ordinances will be modified to accomplish the following goals:

- (1) Residents have complained that recreational vehicles are parked too near to their side lot lines. This amendment prohibits recreational vehicles from being parked closer than five (5) feet from a side lot line.
- (2) Residents have complained that persons are living in recreational vehicles on residential lots for a protracted period of time. This ordinance reduces the amount of time a person can live in a recreational vehicle on a residential lot from 14 days to five (5) days.

- (3) Residents have complained that persons are parking their recreational vehicles on streets and alleys for a protracted period of time. This ordinance reduces the amount of time a person can park a recreational vehicle in a street or alley to three (3) days.
- (4) Currently, these ordinances do not specifically state that Codes Enforcement may enforce them. The ordinances are modified to make that clear.
- (5) The ordinances are modified to be consistent with Las Cruces Development Code Section 38-57.

The City Council is informed that:

WHEREAS, the parking of recreational vehicles too near to the side lot lines of residences is of concern to the City; and

WHEREAS, the length of time persons are allowed to reside in recreational vehicles on the property of residences is of concern to the City; and

WHEREAS, the length of time recreational vehicles are parked in streets and alleys is of concern to the City; and

WHEREAS, Las Cruces Municipal Code, Sections 27-12-6-17 and 27-12-6-18, should be amended to clarify the authority of Codes Enforcement to enforce them; and

WHEREAS, Las Cruces Municipal Code, Sections 27-12-6-17 and 27-12-6-18, should be amended to conform to Las Cruces Development Code, Section 38-57, *Mobile home parks/recreational vehicle parks*.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LAS CRUCES:

(I)

THAT Las Cruces Municipal Code, Section 27-12-6-17, *Parking restrictions for recreational vehicles*, and Section 27-12-6-18, *Occupation of recreational vehicle*, are amended to read as follows:

Sec. 27-12-6-17. Parking restrictions for recreational vehicles.

A. In areas zoned residential, including multifamily areas, no recreational vehicle may be stored upon any city street or sidewalk, but may be stored in a garage, private driveway, the back yard or the left or right side of a residence, provided that no recreational vehicle shall be parked within five (5) feet of a right or left side lot line.

B. The restrictions set forth in this section shall not apply to the parking of a recreational vehicle on a street or alley immediately abutting the street lot line of the lot upon which the owner or operator of the vehicle resides if such parking is solely in connection with a planned trip, outing or vacation, commencing or ending on the same day of such departure or return, including any loading or unloading of persons and personal effects, or for the preparation of the vehicle in regards to such departure or return; provided, however, that:

(1) Under no circumstances will a recreational vehicle be allowed on a street or alley for longer than three (3) days.

(2) Living in a recreational vehicle that is parked on the street or in a front yard is prohibited.

(3) Living in a recreational vehicle is allowed for a maximum of five (5) days if parked in the garage, the driveway, the back yard or on the left or right side of the residence, provided that the recreational vehicle is not parked within five (5) feet of a left or right side lot line.

(4) In the event the owner can prove an emergency exists, that is, death or illness of an immediate family member, fire, natural disaster, or another reason as determined by Codes Enforcement, the Police Chief or the Community Development Director, including his or her designee, the owner may be granted a 30-day extension of living in a recreational vehicle.

C. Codes Enforcement shall have the authority to enforce this ordinance.

Sec. 27-12-6-18. Occupation of recreational vehicle.

It shall be unlawful to occupy any recreational vehicle for residence purposes anywhere in the city, except as provided in Sections 27-12-6-17 and 38-57 and in a duly established trailer park maintained in accordance with all applicable state statutes and city ordinances. Codes Enforcement shall have the authority to enforce this ordinance.

(II)

THAT City staff is authorized to do all deeds necessary to accomplish the intent of this Ordinance.

Sec. 27-12-6-17. Parking restrictions for recreational vehicles.

A. In areas zoned residential, including multifamily areas, no recreational vehicle may be stored upon any city street or sidewalk, but may be stored in a garage or private driveway, the back yard or the left or right side of a residence, provided that no recreational vehicle shall be parked within five (5) feet of a right or left side lot line.

~~_____ (1) Recreational vehicles with four wheels or less will be allowed regardless of length, with no time limit.~~

~~_____ (2) Recreational vehicles with greater than four wheels will be allowed for a maximum of 14 days.~~

~~_____ (3) _____ (1) Under no circumstances will a recreational vehicle be allowed on a street or alley for longer than three (3) days.~~

~~_____ (2) Living in a recreational vehicle that is parked on the street or in a front yard will be prohibited, regardless of the number of wheels.~~

~~(43) Living in a recreational vehicle will be allowed for a maximum of 14 five (5) days if parked in the garage, the driveway, the back yard or on the left or right side or back yard of a the residence, provided that the recreational vehicle is not parked within five (5) feet of a left or right side lot line.~~

~~(54) In the event the owner can prove an emergency exists, that is, death or illness of an immediate family member, fire, natural disaster, or another reason as determined by codes enforcement, the police chief can grant Codes Enforcement, the Police Chief or the Community Development Director, including his or her designee, the owner may be granted a 30-day extension of living in a recreational vehicle.~~

~~_____ C. Codes Enforcement shall have the authority to enforce this ordinance.~~

Sec. 27-12-6-18. Occupation of recreational vehicle.

It shall be unlawful to occupy any recreational vehicle for residence purposes anywhere in the city, except as provided in Sections 27-12-6-17, and 38-57 and in a duly established trailer park maintained in accordance with all applicable state statutes and city ordinances. Codes Enforcement shall have the authority to enforce this ordinance.
