18 Mayor Miyagishima asked if anyone had any conflicts with anything on the agenda?

20 Mayor Miyagishima said I have a conflict with the appointment to the Airport Advisory Board; Mr.  
21 John Darden has done some work for me in the past.

25 Mayor Miyagishima read a Closed Meeting Statement and said the Las Cruces City Council and

6 Mayor Miyagishima read a Closed Meeting Statement and said the Las Cruces City Council met in  
7 Closed Session at 4:24 p.m. on March 29, 2011. The following members were in attendance: Mayor  
8 Miyagishima, Councillor Connor, Councillor Small, Councillor Sorg, Councillor Thomas, City  
9 Manager Robert Garza, Interim Assistant City Manager Brian Denmark, Interim City Attorney Harry  
10 (Pete) Connelly and Attorney Damien Martinez. The discussion for Item 1 concluded at 4:55 p.m.  
11 and only those limited items stated in the posted notice were discussed which was pending litigation  
12 in the matter of Hernandez v. Frias, Baker, City of Las Cruces USDCNM, Civ-10-0351.

14 Mayor Miyagishima read a Closed Meeting Statement and said the Las Cruces City Council met in  
15 Closed Session at 5:00 p.m. on March 29, 2011. The following members were in attendance: Mayor  
16 Miyagishima, Councillor Connor (left before meeting adjourned), Councillor Small, Councillor  
17 Sorg, Councillor Thomas, City Manager Robert Garza, Interim Assistant City Manager Brian  
18 Denmark, Interim City Attorney Harry (Pete) Connelly, Work Comp. Mark Castillo and Attorney  
19 Damien Martinez. The meeting adjourned at 5:08 p.m. and only those limited items stated in the  
20 posted notice were discussed which was pending litigation in Workers Compensation Cases.

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24 **III. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

25

26 Rudy Aragon, Member of the Public said I have been to every agency there is and I have made  
27 contact with Mayor Miyagishima.

28

29 Mayor Miyagishima said the reason I told you that I couldn't speak to you anymore was because you  
30 informed me that you had retained an attorney and would possibly be suing the City of Las Cruces.

31

32 Rudy Aragon said I asked to speak with you before I retained an attorney and I still haven't retained  
33 an attorney. My child's mother was charged with assault with a deadly weapon and child abuse in  
34 September 2009. I received documentation from CYFD that shows my son had high levels of drugs  
35 in his system which they have given to the Las Cruces Police Department but nothing has been done.  
36 The Mayor is now blocking all my emails to him and I would like to pass my phone around to  
37 Council to prove it.

38

39 Mayor Miyagishima said I told you that once you brought up that you might sue the City then I can't  
40 have any further conversations with you.

41

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1 Russ Warner, Member of the Public said I just want to thank Chief Williams for the recent Police  
2 operation that netted a lot of cell phone violations. I would like to encourage the Chief to keep doing  
3 this throughout the entire city.

4

5 George Murphy, Member of the Public said I would like to open the door for Agenda 21, the United  
6 Nations is trying to control the United States and take our weapons away. I would ask that you  
7 reconsider what you get from the United Nations because it is run by thugs that want to take us  
8 down.

9

10 Jim Harbison, Member of the Public said some of the Council members and the Mayor have  
11 repeatedly denied supporting Agenda 21 but as part of the Sustainability Program, Las Cruces pays  
12 dues to the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives which is referred to as  
13 "ICLEA" and it is a United Nations sanctioned organization. Councillor Sorg has admitted in emails  
14 that he supports ICLEA and I would imagine that the rest of the Council does as well, except for  
15 Councillor Thomas. The City's membership to ICLEA does by default or by intent supports Agenda  
16 21. I speak for a lot of people who want this membership terminated immediately because it is a  
17 threat to the American concept of private property.

18

19 Tarce Peterson, Member of the Public said I am the Research and Publication Chair for the Las  
20 Cruces Tea Party and I am here to invite all of you to our meeting this Thursday at the Mountain  
21 View Christian Church at 6:30 p.m.

22

23 Councillor Thomas said I want to say that the City Clerk has researched our resolutions and there  
24 has not been one passed to support Agenda 21. I want to mention that Agenda 21 was signed in 1992  
25 by 178 governments and there are twenty-seven principals that have to do with Agenda 21. I have  
26 met people from several different countries that give up their time to go to communities to teach  
27 people how not to destroy their environment which is what sustainability is all about. We did pass  
28 a Sustainability Plan which is about conserving resources and saving money.

29

30 Councillor Small said I went to the Butterfield Range War event on Saturday; I believe very strongly  
31 in our second amendment right and I think we all believe in our right for private property. I think it  
32 is wrong for people to be thinking that there is some kind of a conspiracy going on because it  
33 distracts us from what we should be doing which is working on things like water conservation and  
34 energy efficiency.

35

36 Councillor Pedroza said I received a copy of an email that has been circulating from Save our City,  
37 Las Cruces Tea Party and I was disturbed because of the use of the language in it. It states that the  
38 Las Cruces City Council is owned and operated by Progressive Voter Alliance and that is not true.

39

40 Councillor Silva said I appreciate that we have this dialog going because that's what makes this  
41 Country so great. There are several sections of Agenda 21 and one of them is regarding social issues.  
42 We have social issues but sometimes we don't have the financial resources to help everybody in this

1 community. We need to come together, regardless of our differences, and ask “what is going to make  
2 Las Cruces in the next ten, twenty years?”

3  
4 Councillor Connor said I get disturbed by the emails that were mentioned by Councillor Pedroza.  
5 This Council does have a variety of opinions and we all have our different priorities but one priority  
6 isn’t prioritized more than another. I ran for office because this is a non-partisan elected body and  
7 that is what is important to me. There are times that we have to agree to disagree and move on. I  
8 don’t think there should be any applause or booing in these chambers because it only shuts down  
9 those who may have a smaller voice and we need to respect their thoughts also.

11 Councillor Small Moved to Adopt Resolution No. 11-203 and Councillor Thomas Seconded the  
12 motion.

16 Councillor Silva asked was this committee dissolved? I thought the Balloon Festival we sponsored  
17 was a great event and I was thinking we could turn it over to this committee and they could sell  
18 tickets to it.

19

20 Mayor Miyagishima said the City Manager is going to be listing all the events and the cost of those  
21 events that we sponsor.

22

23 Robert Garza, City Manager said the reason this resolution is before you today is because this  
24 committee was formed under a resolution several years ago and the City Manager and Department  
25 heads were to be part of this committee but over the years there has been a delegation of authority  
26 to staff. The amount of money that this committee spends is within the City Manager's authority so  
27 instead of them having to come before Council with their events, we decided to make this a City  
28 Manager Policy.

29

30 Jennifer Martin, Co-Chair of the Employee Benefit Committee said our primary income comes from  
31 the vending machines and that is enough money to provide our services which are things like  
32 providing retirement plaques to employees, sending flowers to employees that have been hospitalized  
33 or had a birth or death in their family and we do try to have a couple of events every year. This  
34 resolution would reorganize this committee and put us under the City Manager's Policy.

35

36 Councillor Connor said I just want to say that I have never been in favor of us sponsoring things like  
37 tables at events because it isn't included in our budget but I think this committee does a great job.

38

39 Mayor Miyagishima said there are some events that are for very good causes, like the Red Cross, that  
40 I think it is important for us to support.

41

42 Councillor Connor said you misunderstood me, I didn't mean those types of events.

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1  
2 Councillor Small said I think this is a positive step forward and I strongly support it.

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6 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Adopt Resolution No. 11-203 and it was  
7 Unanimously APPROVED. 7-0

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11 (5) Resolution No. 11-204: A Resolution Approving the Issuance of a Waiver of the

20 Ken Mompellier, Convention and Visitors Bureau Director said all the information and maps are  
21 included in your packet and we have been working with the University and the Liquor Commission  
22 regarding the boundaries for this license.

23  
24 Councillor Silva said this is on the University's property; correct?

25  
26 Ken Mompellier said that is correct. The University does already have other licenses for other areas  
27 on their campus.

28  
29 Councillor Connor said with a Government Liquor License, you can't go more than ten days without  
30 serving; correct?

31  
32 Ken Mompellier said we are trying to verify that but we don't think that's necessarily true.

36 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Adopt Resolution No. 11-204 and it was  
37 Unanimously APPROVED. 7-0

42 **A PUBLIC HEARING MUST BE HELD:**

- 1 Mayor Miyagishima said the Public Hearing for Resolution No. 11-205 is now open; is there anyone  
2 who wishes to speak against this item?  
3
- 4 Chris Perez, Member of the Public asked is Global Spectrum going to lease the City's liquor license?  
5
- 6 Robert Garza, City Manager said yes, we will be leasing it to Global Spectrum as our agent.  
7
- 8 Chris Perez asked how much are you going to charge them?  
9
- 10 Robert Garza said we will begin those negotiations with them if this resolution is approved.  
11
- 12 Chris Perez asked whose account will the money from the liquor sales be deposited?  
13
- 14 Robert Garza said those things will have to be worked out within the agreement and once we have  
15 an agreement then we will bring it back before Council for their approval.  
16
- 17 Chris Perez said it doesn't make sense because you can't share the profits of the liquor sales.  
18
- 19 Councillor Silva said there is still going to be another step beyond this one which will be the lease  
20 agreement and this is how most Convention Centers work but we will need to address the issue of  
21 the liability insurance when we enter into negotiations for the lease agreement.  
22
- 23 Chris Perez said I just want to make sure the City is covered because if someone does get hurt, it is  
24 a City building and it would be coming out of all of our pockets.  
25
- 26 Emma Murillo, Member of the Public said you are going to be getting all the Texans coming over  
27 here for liquor on Sundays and it is going to create more alcoholism in New Mexico.  
28
- 29 Victor Perez, Member of the Public asked what is the license costing the City?  
30
- 31 Harry (Pete) Connelly, Interim City Attorney said \$1,300.  
32
- 33 Victor Perez said I think that is very unfair because us business people have to pay \$300,000 for a  
34 liquor license and for the City to only pay \$1,300 and then turn it over to these other people is unfair.  
35
- 36 Ron Camunez, Member of the Public said it is important that you have professional staff to run this  
37 because we need to show everyone inside and outside of Las Cruces that we run a class-act at the  
38 Convention Center.  
39
- 40 Mayor Miyagishima closed the Public Hearing.  
41

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1           Resolution No. 11-205: A Resolution Approving the Issuance of a Governmental Liquor  
2           License to the City of Las Cruces, for its Use at the Las Cruces Convention Center, Located

5 Councillor Connor Moved to Adopt Resolution No. 11-205 and Councillor Sorg Seconded the  
6 motion.

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10 Councillor Silva said there are a lot of moving parts to the Convention Center and maybe we need  
11 to have a work shop to discuss it and to discuss how we can help all the small businesses in town.

12

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15 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Adopt Resolution No. 11-205 and it was  
16 Unanimously APPROVED. 7-0

25 Councillor Small Moved to Adopt Resolution No. 11-206 and Councillor Thomas Seconded the  
26 motion.

27

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30 David Dollahon, Neighborhood Services Administrator gave an overhead presentation and said this  
31 is for the purchase of land for the Meals on Wheels kitchen facility. There have been CDBG funds  
32 that have already been approved for the site selection, design and land acquisition. The executed  
33 purchase agreement sets the price at \$221,500 less the \$5,000 payment made at signing which bring  
34 the total amount due to \$216,500.

35

36 Mayor Miyagishima said I think Meals on Wheels is an excellent service provided by the City.

37

38 Councillor Small asked how did you come up with the price of the land?

39

40 David Dollahon said there were two appraisals done and we negotiated a price between the two  
41 appraisals.

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Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Adopt Resolution No. 11-206 and it was Unanimously APPROVED. 7-0

Submitted by the City of Las Cruces, Property Owner. (Z2823)

Mayor Miyagishima and Council agreed to be bring this item back.

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**X. GENERAL DISCUSSION**

**1. MAYOR**

Mayor Miyagishima passed.

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**2. CITY COUNCIL**

Councillor Thomas said I would like to give credit to Carmela Espinoza for the hard work she has done with problems that were brought to her by the new District 6 Neighborhood Association.

I sent out information regarding recycling over the weekend to my District 6 list and I would like to request that we put that information on our website.

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Councillor Sorg passed.

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Robert Garza, City Manager said I thought Council might have questions regarding the recycling bins so I asked Klaus Kemmer to give you some information regarding that project.

Klaus Kemmer, Solid Waste Administrator said today is the first day of pick up for the recycling bins and about 70% to 80% of customers put their bins out for pick up. The routes were completed by about 1:15 p.m. so they did a good job of picking up the containers. We will be reviewing their work and speaking with them over the next several months to make any necessary adjustments.

Councillor Small asked what is the policy for rentals and apartments?

Klaus Kemmer said commercial dumpster areas won't get recycling bins.

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Councillor Small said I would like to congratulate the Breakfast Optimist Club which will be celebrating their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary this Thursday at the Las Cruces Convention Center.

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1 We have Keep Las Cruces Beautiful coming up on the 16<sup>th</sup> and there are a lot of folks already signed  
2 up but you can still sign up for this event.

3

4 The Border Book Festival is coming up this weekend in Mesilla and it is a great event.

5

6 I want to thank Donna Richmond from La Pinon for putting on the outstanding Cowboys vs. Cops  
7 Shooting Benefit Event.

8

9 I want to thank Dan Soriano for responding to a few issues that have come up.

10

11 I want to thank Mike Johnson and his staff for responding to some street issues.

12

13 I want to thank Chief Williams for his help regarding some graffiti issues.

14

15 The Las Cruces Green Chamber of Commerce did an outstanding job with the kick-off for recycling  
16 and I want to mention that there is going to be a Green Chamber Meeting next Thursday.

17

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19

20 Councillor Pedroza said there will be an Earth Day event in mid-April at Young Park and there will  
21 be activities for everyone.

22

23 The School Gardens are getting closer and closer to being a reality.

24

25 My three times a week Walk and Talk at Young Park is getting more and more people and I would  
26 like to extend my invitation to everybody to come and join us.

27

28 I am getting ready to begin working on trying to get a program going to help weatherize old homes  
29 and I would like to have anyone interested in helping to contact me.

30

31

32

33 Councillor Connor said we are in the process of planning the September 11<sup>th</sup> event which will be the  
34 ten-year remembrance of the attack on the United States. This event will be held at City Hall and we  
35 have lined up several performances.

36

37 The Student Council of Picacho Middle School will be here on April 25<sup>th</sup> and they are going to take  
38 a tour of City Hall. They will be attending the Work Session for about twenty minutes and I would  
39 like to ask that we have some kind of recognition for them.

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1 Councillor Silva said I would like to give the Police Chief kudos for the work that was done over  
2 the weekend.

3

4 I attended the first Re-Districting Committee meeting and it was a very spirited meeting. I think this  
5 group of people really want to make a difference.

6

7 This past Friday was the monthly Ramble and I'd like to compliment the Jaynes Corporation for  
8 having the concrete poured so people could walk around for this event.

9

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12 3. **CITY MANAGER**

13 A. Other items - Information Only.

14

15 Robert Garza, City Manager said I want to remind everyone that we will not be having a TIDD  
16 Board Meeting next week.

17

18 Robert Scaling will be giving you an update on the utility billing process.

19

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21

22 Robert Scaling, Treasure gave an overhead presentation and said the major problems that  
23 occurred caused delayed billing and that caused some people to get two bills in the same month.  
24 There were issues with the calculation of the solid waste and with actual meter readings not  
25 computing correctly in Munis. We feel like we have fixed all of those problems and we have had  
26 to make enhancements to the system because of things like the sale of Rio Grande Gas and for  
27 the new recycling program. We will always have some kind of issue going on which means there  
28 will always periodically be issues with the system. The three primary issues that we are currently  
29 working on are the enhancements to the delinquent process, the internal billing process and the  
30 electronic billing process.

31

32 Mayor Miyagishima said I know it's a computer issue but the one thing that really bothers the  
33 residents that have auto pay is that when it didn't go through one month then the next month they  
34 have a past due balance and two payments come out of their account in one month.

35

36 Robert Scaling said that is a unique event that occurs when we have a delay in the billing process  
37 but it doesn't happen that often.
