29 William Ticknor, Museum Systems Director gave a presentation and said there was a previous
30 resolution (Resolution 06-210) that designated this building to be the future home of the Museum
31 for Natural History and this is to amend that resolution to designate this building to the Las Cruces
32 Museum of Art.

33

34 Councillor Thomas asked is this only for offices; you are going to keep the current building for the
35 gallery, correct?

36

37 William Ticknor said that is correct.

38

39 Councillor Connor said I pulled this off of consent because I had some constituents that wanted more
40 information regarding this move and I think it is great that we will be getting rid of at least one of
41 our big leases.

42

43 William Ticknor said this will also expand our gallery space. (and continued with his presentation)

1

2 Mayor Miyagishima said I know there are only certain types of renovations we can make to historical
3 buildings and I know there are issues with the heating and cooling systems in that building.

4

5 William Ticknor said there are a lot of restrictions on historical properties and we will be working
6 with the Historical Preservation Department for our renovations. We only want to put an energy
7 efficient HVAC system in this building which won't be a problem due to the way the roof is
8 structured.

9

10 Councillor Thomas said there is funding available for the preservation of historical building but I
11 don't know if it would be available for this case.

12

13 William Ticknor said we are going to be looking at all our funding options.

14

15 Kerry Hampton, Member of the Public said I support the move of the Museum of Art to this
16 building.

17

18 Heather Pollard, Downtown Las Cruces said I want to congratulate Will Ticknor and his staff for all
19 they have done with our museums.

20

21 George Griffin, Museum Board Member said the idea of reusing this history building is a very
22 attractive idea.

23

24 Greg Smith, Downtown Las Cruces Partnership said I think this is a very good idea.

25

28 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Adopt Resolution No. 09-270 and it was
29 Unanimously APPROVED. 7-0

41 Terrence Moore, City Manager made introduction comments.

42

1 Mark Sutter, Finance Director gave a presentation and said there was a softening of the economy this
2 year which we made mid year adjustments to accommodate our economic state and we continued
3 to be sensitive to our tax funded activities. We were directed by Council to create a balanced 2010
4 budget and in creating this budget, we had to project how this year was going to end.

5

6 Dick Gebhart, Budget Director gave a presentation and said there was about five million dollars in
7 reductions for this budget. There are some variations with the amounts for the Parks Department
8 and the Recreation Department and that is due to that fact that they are in the process of reorganizing
9 those departments. The largest piece of our budget is spent on personnel and about twenty three
10 percent of it is spent on operation costs.

11

12 Councillor Thomas said there was an article regarding the budget in the Sun News Sunday's paper
13 which had some incorrect information in it.

14

15 Mark Sutter said that is why we re-showed the slides from the last budget adjustment.

16

17 Terrence Moore said we adapted this presentation to address any misconceptions regarding the
18 budget.

19

20 Councillor Thomas said I think we need to include explanations with our budget presentations and
21 it needs to be available on our website for the public to view.

22

23 Mark Sutter said we will look into that suggestion before next year's budget.

24

25 Councillor Thomas said I think we need to have a work session regarding how the budget reports
26 are done and presented.

27

28 Terrence Moore said we will set it up for our next work session.

29

30 Mayor Miyagishima said we could just put out a one page summary report for the public.

31

32 Councillor Thomas said I think it would be more useful if it was just put it on our web page.

33

34 Mark Sutter said our budget is available on our website.

35

36 Councillor Archuleta said there have been concerns from some of my constituents in District 3
37 regarding road maintenance and I want to make sure there is funding available for these repairs.

38

39 Mike Johnson, Public Works Director said 1/4% of the GRT goes toward street maintenance.

40

41 Councillor Silva said we do need a more user friendly document for our budget.

42

43 Terrence Moore said we can have a work session in December or January to discuss the format.

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1

2 Councillor Silva said there was an increase from \$310,000 to \$500,000 for the Animal Services
3 Center which was never brought before Council and it should have been brought forward to us.

4

5 Councillor Connor said I would like to thank staff for listening to our direction and not dipping into
6 our reserve account.

7

8 Isaac Chavez, Member of the Public said the Parks Department had to cut their budget which is why
9 we need to have a Quality of Life Tax.

10

11 Dan Jett, Member of the Public said you only want to talk about the General Fund and not the
12 balances of the other funds.

13

14 Ron Camunez, Member of the Public said you are only creating more work for staff because only
15 about ten percent of the public actually looks at this budget.

16

17 Councillor Jones said we have a lot of strength in our reserves and we are fortunate to have a staff
18 that has been through tough times before and we will get through this situation.

19

22 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Adopt Resolution No. 09-274 and it was
23 Unanimously APPROVED. 7-0

5 Eric Martin, Project Management Administrator gave a presentation and said currently, the parking
6 deck is being constructed at the north east end of the new City Hall and they are making progress on
7 the drilling process for the wells as part of our cooling and heating system.

8
9 Councillor Small asked did we consider green furnishings with this RFP process?

11 Eric Martin said we did address green components and did ask that the responding entities give some
12 background and offerings that they had in the green area.

14 Councillor Silva asked what fund is the \$550,000 coming out of; is it the general fund?

16 Eric Martin said the \$680,000 is coming out of the general fund and other funding sources that are
17 identified in the budget documentation.

19 Councillor Thomas said I would like to have explanations included with the documentation for
20 change orders. The public needs to be able to see the big picture.

23 to the appropriate fund account.
