TITLE: A RESOLUTION RESCINDING AND REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 09-288, ADOPTED JUNE 1, 2009 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF LAS CRUCES TO CONTINUE TO ACT AS THE FISCAL AGENT FOR THE MESILLA VALLEY SAFETY COUNCIL AND TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR A GRANT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$27,091 TO THE NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

PURPOSE(S) OF ACTION: To rescind and repeal a Council Resolution adopted on June 1, 2009. To allow the City of Las Cruces to apply for, accept, and act as the fiscal agent on behalf of various governmental entities of Dona Ana County, a grant from the Traffic Safety Bureau in the amount of \$27,091.

BACKGROUND / KEY ISSUES / CONTRIBUTING FACTORS: Shortly after the adoption of Resolution No. 09-288, which authorized an Application for up to \$60,627.67 of Community DWI funds on behalf of several governmental entities, the Traffic Safety Bureau notified the City's Project Manager that Dona Ana County had decided to file a separate application, and that it (the County) was eligible for \$53,804 and the remaining governmental entities, the City of Sunland Park, Village of Hatch, Town of Mesilla and City of Las Cruces, was eligible for \$27,091. As a result, the previous Resolution's intent has become impossible to carry out. This revised resolution reflects the down-scaled scope of the program.

Community DWI funds are generated by a \$75 fee assessed to each DWI-related conviction. The funds are credited to the governmental entity most closely affiliated with the sentencing court. If one or more of those governmental entities follow the rules set out by the Traffic Safety Bureau, that funding is returned to those entities, but may only be used to combat DWI-related issues in that geographic area. Money not applied for is permanently lost.

The Mesilla Valley Safety Council (MVSC) was established in the 1980s (and prior to the availability of these funds) to try to address various traffic safety issues in Dona Ana County. Each year it evaluates a variety of proposals and recommends activities it believes will impact the rate of DWI and reduce binge and underage drinking. The MVSC is the local "Task Force" that oversees the program aspects of CDWI funding. The Task Force is composed of persons representing the entities and agencies listed in the Information and Authorization Form included as part of draft "Exhibit A," Grant Application. The City of Las Cruces, as the fiscal agent, administers the grant as per a proposed Memorandum of Agreement with the Town of Mesilla, the Village of Hatch and the City of Sunland Park, also included in Exhibit A.

This grant requires no matching funds on the part of the City. The MVSC uses a part time Project Manager, a position required by the Traffic Safety Bureau, in order to properly administer the grant. Grant funds may not be used to pay for the services this person provides.

The MVSC sought and received numerous proposals for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009. Any entity or organization which works to reduce DWI or binge and underage drinking was invited to apply for funding. Each proposal was reviewed by the MVSC, acting as a review committee. The goal of the review was to initiate activities or programs in as many areas of the county as possible and to continue its focus on combating binge and underage drinking.

The MVSC, at its regularly scheduled meeting on April 21, 2009, discussed each proposal for grant funds. As a result of funding revisions, the recommendations were modified by the Executive Board on June 17, 2009. The MVSC makes the following revised recommendations:

1. \$13,000 to the Las Cruces Police Department for a combination of saturation patrols and underage enforcement activities, including cops in shops, party patrols, stings and shoulder taps.
2. \$5,000 to J & R Enterprises for continued involvement in and development of the Underage Drinking Prevention Coalition and other County-wide activities to combat binge and underage drinking.
3. \$2,400 to the Village of Hatch for overtime to conduct saturation patrols throughout the year.
4. \$6,000 to Doña Ana Action for Youth to conduct several high school based binge and underage drinking programs at high schools in Anthony, Santa Teresa, area Las Cruces high schools, and additional schools as funding permits.

6. \$691 to the Project Manager for travel, per diem, advertising, office supplies, and other miscellaneous expenses to carry out the above program.

1. **Approve as presented: Will allow the application process to continue with the proposed expenditures recommended by the Mesilla Valley Safety Council.**

3. **Modify the Resolution: Council may modify as it sees fit. However, this may require the other governmental entities to re-assess their participation and/or may delay the application's submission past the established deadline. Both of these alternatives present unknown risks.**

RESOLUTION NO. 10-028

A RESOLUTION RESCINDING AND REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 09-288, ADOPTED JUNE 1, 2009 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF LAS CRUCES TO CONTINUE TO ACT AS THE FISCAL AGENT FOR THE MESILLA VALLEY SAFETY COUNCIL AND TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR A GRANT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$27,091 TO THE NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

The City Council is informed that:

WHEREAS, the incidence of crashes and fatalities related to DWI, and problems associated with binge and underage drinking in New Mexico, has been among the highest in the nation for years; and

WHEREAS, the Mesilla Valley Safety Council is the recognized "Task Force" for development of a safety plan, under Department of Transportation, Traffic Safety Bureau regulations, on behalf of all participating governmental entities in Doña Ana County; and

WHEREAS, through the Mesilla Valley Safety Council, area law enforcement and other agencies and organizations have agreed to conduct joint activities to reduce DWI and underage/binge drinking; and

WHEREAS, the intent of Resolution 09-288, adopted on June 1, 2009, can no longer be carried out due to changed circumstances, and

WHEREAS, the City of Las Cruces, City of Sunland Park, Village of Hatch, and Town of Mesilla, agree that the City of Las Cruces will be the fiscal agent for this grant.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the governing body of the City of Las Cruces, New Mexico:

THAT Resolution 09-288 is hereby rescinded and repealed.

(II)

THAT the attached draft grant application, marked as Exhibit "A" is hereby approved for submission to the Department of Transportation, Traffic Safety Bureau.

(III)

THAT the City of Las Cruces will act as the fiscal agent for the grant funds, should they be made available to the Mesilla Valley Safety Council.

THAT City staff is hereby authorized to do all deeds necessary in the accomplishment of the herein above.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Comprehensive Community DWI Prevention Program is between the City of Las Cruces, Town of Mesilla, Village of Hatch, and the City of Sunland Park.

This Agreement is effective on the 1st day of July, 2009 but is not a valid and binding Agreement until executed by all parties thereto. The parties agree as follows:

To file a joint application to the New Mexico Department of Transportation, Traffic Safety Bureau for funding of a comprehensive Community DWI Prevention Program that reflects an integrated approach to our mutual problem of driving while intoxicated, binge and underage drinking.

The Cities of Las Cruces and Sunland Park, Town of Mesilla, and the Village of Hatch agree to combine their funds and resources in achieving a common goal of removing DWI from the streets and highways of Dona Ana County, and reducing underage drinking, thus reducing highway traffic crashes that are alcohol related.

We have established a joint task force (Mesilla Valley Safety Council) as provided for and described in the CDWI Program Guide. The Application will be submitted in the name of the Mesilla Valley Safety Council.

The City of Las Cruces agrees to be the fiscal agent to apply for the grant funds, and the other parties to this Agreement consent to this arrangement. The total amount of funding available is \$ 27,091.

The parties understand there is no requirement for matching funds for this program funding.






