

BACKGROUND / KEY ISSUES / CONTRIBUTING FACTORS:

The City Council (Council) repealed Las Cruces Municipal Code Chapter 7 and enacted a new Chapter 7 known as the Animal Control Ordinance on November 3, 2014. The Ordinance authorizes the Council to impose various fees by separate Council Resolution to encourage responsible animal ownership and to partially offset the cost of enforcement. Therefore, the Council needs to approve a Resolution establishing these fees.

The City's Codes Enforcement Section in consultation with the City Attorney's Office recommends that the Council approve the fees shown on Exhibit "A". The Animal Control Ordinance Fee Schedule attached as Exhibit "A" identifies by Las Cruces Municipal Code section number and section title each section of the Animal Control Ordinance which authorizes the imposition of fees by separate Council Resolution as well as a detailed breakdown of the recommended fees so authorized.

All animal related fees previously approved by Council, including but not limited to those animal control special licensing permit fees approved in Council Resolution No. 96-17, as well as all animal related fees developed and used by staff, should be replaced with the fees shown on Exhibit "A".

ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE FEE SCHEDULE

Las Cruces Municipal Code Chapter 7 entitled the Animal Control Ordinance authorizes the imposition of different fees to be set by resolution of the City Council. LCMC 1997, Section 7-40 provides that all permit fees, license fees, transport fees and dead animal removal fees, including various application fees, collected pursuant to Chapter 7, shall be remitted to the City and placed in the City's general fund. The fees approved in City Council Resolution No. 15-_____ are set forth below:

Section 7-11. Pet licensure and owner identification.

The pet license fee, also known as an intact animal permit fee, for a dog or cat judged to be over three (3) months of age or older shall be \$50.00 per year except as set forth below.

The pet license fee for a qualified service animal shall be \$ -0- per year.

The pet license fee for a sterilized dog or cat, or for a dog or cat that should not be sterilized due to age or physical condition, shall be \$7.00 per year.

The pet license fee for a sterilized dog or cat owned by or in the custody of a person 65 years of age or older shall be \$5.00 per year.

Section 7-17. Deceased animal disposal requirements.

The removal fee for an animal carcass from private property at the request of the animal owner or property owner shall be \$10.00 per pick-up, which fee shall be paid by the requester.

Section 7-30. Multi-animal site permit.

An initial application fee for a residential multi-animal site shall be \$5.00 per site.

The residential multi-animal site permit shall be \$20.00 per year per site.

The certificate of registration fee for the owner of a dangerous dog shall be \$200.00 per year as additionally authorized in NMSA 1978, Section 77-1A-5(B) of the New Mexico Dangerous Dog Act.

Section 7-43. Impoundment and detention.

The fee to transport a relinquished animal to the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley ("ASCMV") or to another suitable facility shall be \$20.00 per animal.

Section 7-44. Reclamation.

Impoundment and boarding fees shall be established by the Director of the ASCMV, and shall be paid to, collected and retained by the ASCMV.

A microchip fee for any microchip implanted in a dog, cat or ferret by the ASCMV shall be set by and payable to the ASCMV.

A sterilization deposit will be determined by and paid to the ASCMV and will be reimbursed by the ASCMV upon timely proof of sterilization.
