34 is usually enough distance to keep the fires from occurring. We also have people who alert us.

Srijana Basnyat, Senior Planner gave an overhead presentation.

Krysten Aguilar, Food Planning and Policy Coordinator for La Semilla Food Center gave an overhead presentation.

Councillor Sorg said I hope we can eliminate the food shortage with this policy.

Councillor Eakman asked do you plan to come back and answer questions in the vision statement?

Krysten Aguilar said it can be brought back depending on scheduling with staff. Prioritizing will take a couple of months.

Srijana Basnyat said we don't have a time line but we do try to time our future projects with allocation processes.

Councillor Eakman said I would like to see more material brought forward.

Councillor Pedroza said some of the things we need more information on could be brought up during a work session. We need to look at community gardens more as there is a relationship between buyers and the school district.

Councillor Levatino said I want to support this but I agree with Councillor Eakman that we need more information.

David Weir, Community Development Director said plans usually set out the vision and goals to establish policy. If we don't adopt a plan, we won't have direction.

Councillor Eakman said in my mind a plan has more to it and I feel like this is like signing a blank check.

David Weir said this is not a financial plan. It is policy. We support healthy foods within the community and there are 33 strategies to go about that.

Councillor Gandara said I support this but have reservations about it being very general. I'd like to see some outcomes and deliverables.

Councillor Pedroza asked will the City Council be giving up its ability about spending money in the future?

1 David Weir said no.

2

3 Councillor Sorg said we are just agreeing with the goals, objectives and recommendations.

4

5 Srijana Basnyat asked do you wish us to come back with a plan and implementation plan?

6

7 Councillor Eakman said yes.

8

9 David Cresswell, Member of the Public said Las Cruces has the opportunity to be a paradigm for  
10 the state with this plan. I would approve this as a conditional consensus and work out the details  
11 later.

12

13 Linda Dallas, Member of the Public said I agree with this but there are a lot of holes that need to  
14 be defined. More educational outreach will be needed.

15

16 Nathan Small, Former Councillor said this is about economic opportunity, individual freedom  
17 and choice, and collectively seeing Las Cruces as an agricultural region. Budget contributions  
18 will be smaller than you think.

13 The uses will be more general.

15 Councillor Eakman asked how will the codes relate to each other?

17 Tim Pitts said we have a small staff working together but you will be getting rid of the CBD code  
18 and replacing it with this code.

20 David Weir said the building code and standards will still be in effect.

21

22 Councillor Eakman asked have you discussed how you plan on insulating the City against  
23 potential legal challenges?

24

25 David Weir said the building code is overseen by the state and our inspectors are expected to be  
26 certified by them. All of our codes have an appeal process.

27

28 Councillor Eakman asked how do you plan on establishing fairness and equality?

29

30 David Weir said we go back to the code to make sure minimums are met, we look at past  
31 practices and precedents, and we also look at plans for that area that have been adopted.

32

33 Councillor Gandara asked how will you promote the vacant buildings being there and are they  
34 required to meet the standards?

35

36 Tim Pitts said we are not asking them to make renovations. We have the infill development  
37 process, which gives incentives for redevelopment.

38

39 Councillor Gandara asked what other incentives might there be for the property owner?

40

41 Tim Pitts said variances and they don't need to provide parking.

42

1 Marian Kathleen, Member of the Public said the Downtown is a ghost town with vacant  
2 buildings. I think the form based code does not have an advocacy for local business owners.

3  
4 Steve Newby, Member of the Public said as a local architect we want to work closely with City  
5 staff to implement this code.
