I. OPENING CEREMONIES

Mayor Miyagishima called the meeting to order. Councillor Pedroza led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Jennifer Martinez from PIO presented the Pet of the Week.

Mayor Miyagishima presented a Mayor's Public Citation to Socorro Caballero, Bus Operator for her great customer service and honesty in finding and returning \$680 to Ms. Kearns that she found on the bus route that she drives.

Mayor Miyagishima presented a Mayor's Public Citation to Loretta Covarrubia and Margaret Hensley (Transportation Department) and Mayor's Community Citation to Many Martinez, Security Guard for their participation/assistance in contacting Ms. Kearns.

II. CONFLICT OF INTEREST INQUIRY BY MAYOR AS REQUIRED BY LCMC SECTION 2-27(E)(2). *At the opening of each council meeting, the chairperson shall ask if any member of the city council, city manager, or any member of the city staff has any known conflict of interest with any item on the agenda.*

Councillor Eakman said my son was homeless but I don't think that biases me on #11.

2 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said I don't believe that biases Councillor Eakman.

3

4 Mayor Miyagishima said as long as the award doesn't go directly to him then we're good.

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8 **III. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

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10 Michael Wright, Member of the Public said I own Wright's Music Box on the Downtown Mall.

11 Parking is important and I think a board needs to be established.

12

13 Mayor Miyagishima said we could probably put together an ad hoc committee.

14

15 Michael Wright said I think we need a committee to do an ongoing study.

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17 Mayor Miyagishima asked how soon were you looking to establish this?

18

19 Michael Wright said now.

20

21 Councillor Sorg asked is there such a committee?

22

23 Daniel Avila said we have a plan but there is no committee.

24

25 Councillor Levatino asked are you asking for a committee to go look at the old studies or a new
26 study?

27

28 Michael Wright said both previous studies have suggested a parking commission to plan for future
29 parking issues.

30

31 Donna O'Daniel, Member of the Public said I'm Chairman of the Las Cruces Support Your Local
32 Police Committee. Resistant to police has been more prevalent. The purchase of body cameras will
33 protect them from possible threats and allegations. We urge City Council not to become involved
34 in national programs designed to destroy local control of police.

35

36 Jean Conway, Member of the Public said I'm Vice President of Velo Cruces. We want to encourage
37 a full time staff for bicycles and pedestrians. The East Mesa is lacking bicycle facilities.

38

39 Mayor Miyagishima said I have people who want to volunteer as I don't think we can move forward
40 with a full time position. What we have in Metro Verde is the gold standard we would like to see
41 in all subdivisions.

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35 Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Resolution No. 16-244 and Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Seconded
36 the motion.

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40 Sonia Saldana, Senior Programs Administrator gave an overhead presentation.

41
42 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said the only thing I have to suggest is to change December 21, 2016 to 2015.

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2 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-244 and it was
3 Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

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7 (9) Resolution No.16-245: A Resolution for Approval of an Amendment to the Management
8 Agreement (Agreement) Between the City of Las Cruces (City) and the Dona Ana Arts
9 Council (DAAC), for an Increase in the Original Contract Amount from \$100,000.00 to
10 \$120,000.00 for Year Three of a Possible Five-Year Management Agreement, for Operation
11 of the Rio Grande Theater (RGT), Located at 211 N. Main Street, Las Cruces, New Mexico,
12 Subject to Annual City Council Approval.

13

14 Councillor Sorg Moved to Approve Resolution No. 16-245 and Councillor Gandara Seconded the
15 motion.

16

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19 Eric Martin, Project Management Administrator gave an overhead presentation.

20

21 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said item 2 should give authorization to the City Manager.

22

23 Councillor Pedroza said it would be important to put measurable goals in the contract.

24

25 Eric Martin said it has been a work in progress.

26

27 Mayor Miyagishima asked can it go out for bid after the five years?

28

29 Eric Martin said it is renewable annually so you can recommend taking a different path.

30

31 Mayor Miyagishima asked what type of information does the City have to show whether or not it is
32 deserving of an additional year of contract or increased funding?

33

34 Eric Martin said we only have two years of information so we recommend an additional year to
35 gather data.

36

37 Mayor Miyagishima asked was there an increase or decrease?

38

39 Eric Martin said historically we've needed to subsidize the funding. They're supplementing their
40 existing funding by \$50,000.

41

42 Councillor Pedroza said I wanted to know what kinds of information we have in terms of what they
43 are able to do, how well they are able to do it, are there plans to reach certain numbers, and what
44 numbers are those.

1

2 Kathleen Albers, Executive Director of the Doña Ana Arts Council said we have a lot of data and
3 those reports get sent to staff on a monthly basis. We've taken on the mission and deliverables of
4 the Arts Council for the theater. We measure qualitative versus quantitative.

5

6 Mayor Miyagishima asked what was your budget last fiscal year?

7

8 Kathleen Albers said we received \$100,000 from the Council and the budget was around \$270,000.

9

10 Mayor Miyagishima asked what was the shortfall?

11

12 Kathleen Albers said the first year we operated at about a \$45,000 shortfall and this year a similar
13 situation.

14

15 Mayor Miyagishima asked if we give you the extra \$20,000, how will you make up the \$25,000
16 shortfall?

17

18 Kathleen Albers said this year we have an investment fund that we're pulling our funds from.

19

20 Councillor Gandara said I know there are two entities who were interested in possibly running the
21 Rio Grande. I think we need clear, measurable outcomes. I have heard concerns about how often
22 the theater sits idle. It may be time to hire a consultant.

23

24 Councillor Sorg said I want to make sure that the money is wisely spent. I suggest putting on one
25 day art classes with artists.

26

27 Mayor Miyagishima asked did we go out to bid?

28

29 Eric Martin said we have not sent any type of request for proposal.

30

31 Mayor Miyagishima said I think we should move forward but maybe look at some of these
32 comparisons in six months when we have more data. We also should come up with a vision
33 statement for them.

34

35 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said I think we should give them something sooner as to what we're looking
36 for.

37

38 Kathleen Albers said if we had a lot of free shows, we wouldn't be generating income. It's a
39 complex process that we have to take into account the quality and type of program.

40

41 Councillor Eakman said I'm confused about what we want the Rio Grande Theater to be. I would
42 like the City staff to come back with what the mission is before December.

43

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1 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said we need to establish for them and for ourselves the expectations.

2

3 Councillor Pedroza said at a work session in September or October we could probably give feedback
4 as to what direction we see the theater going.

5

6 Eric Martin said the board is requesting to release \$10,000 in July, \$5000 in December, and \$5000
7 in June plus the normal monthly payment.

8

9 Councillor Pedroza asked is that a change from the information in the packet?

10

11 Eric Martin said yes, it would be a change to the actual agreement.

12

13 Rusty Babington, City Attorney said the agreement that implements the payments is a separate
14 agreement.

15

16

17

18 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith Moved to Amend Resolution No. 16-245 to change Exhibit A to include the
19 additional amounts of \$10,000 to be released in July of 2016, \$5000 to be released in December of
20 2016, and \$5000 to be released in June of 2017 and Councillor Gandara Seconded the motion.

21

22 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Amend Resolution No. 16-245 to change
23 Exhibit A to include the additional amounts of \$10,000 to be released in July of 2016, \$5000 to be
24 released in December of 2016, and \$5000 to be released in June of 2017 and it was Unanimously
25 Approved. 7-0.

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29 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-245 as amended
30 and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0

7 Karin Byrum, Interim Treasurer gave an overhead presentation.
8
9 Peter Franklin, Bond Council from Modrall Sperling continued with the overhead presentation.
10
11 Mayor Miyagishima asked was the money used to purchase business property?
12
13 Peter Franklin said that is correct.
14
15 Mayor Miyagishima said this exempts them from having to pay property tax.
16
17 Councillor Sorg asked do we have personal or inventory taxes?
18
19 Peter Franklin said that is all part of the assessed value of a commercial piece of property.
20
21 Councillor Sorg asked will the new things they buy be exempt from the taxes?
22
23 Peter Franklin said yes.
24
25 Councillor Sorg asked where is the cheese sold relative to Las Cruces?
26
27 Casey Habersang, CFO of F&A Dairy said primarily they're sold domestically and a couple of local
28 distributors in Las Cruces.
29
30 Councillor Sorg asked what brand name is the cheese?
31
32 Casey Habersang said our label is F&A. We do private label products. The Toucan Market has
33 F&A cheese.
34
35 Councillor Sorg asked will there be change in your employment numbers?
36
37 Casey Habersang said we currently have 15-20 job openings. The bulk of the funding will go
38 towards equipment, which will generate about 20 more jobs.
39
40 Mayor Miyagishima asked what is the average wage you pay?
41

1 Casey Habersang said \$9.50. We also offer a performance incentive bonus for those who show up
2 to work on time and follow the rules.

3

4 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith asked is the new equipment going to require new housing and is that going
5 to be highly visible?

6

7 Casey Habersang said the salt drying pond will be a fenced in property with a couple of large dug
8 in ponds.

9

10 Councillor Pedroza asked what do you do with the water?

11

12 Casey Habersang said the water will evaporate out of the salt ponds and then circulate the water back
13 into the wastewater system.

14

15 Councillor Pedroza asked do you provide transportation to your employees?

16

17 Casey Habersang said a lot of that is by personal vehicles but we have discussed that.

18

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21 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-246 and it was
22 Unanimously Approved. 7-0.

37 Mayor Miyagishima said we have a certain amount of money budgeted for the fiscal year and the
38 money we have left in our contingency funds is being used to make up this difference.

40 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said we might want to consider combining efforts with the state and federal
41 government and look at what other efforts the City is making to help the Veterans long term.

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1 Mayor Miyagishima called for the roll on the Motion to Approve Resolution No. 16-247 and it was

4 private gun shows.

6 Councillor Pedroza said it is fine to put on the agenda.

7

8 Councillor Eakman asked would we be considering this because of the safety effects to the City
9 of Las Cruces?

10

11 Mayor Miyagishima said this would be statewide.

12

13 Councillor Levatino said I would request that we have enough time to check all the statistics.

14

15 Councillor Gandara said I'm in agreement of bringing it forward.

16

17 Councillor Sorg asked could you add criminal and mental health background checks?

18

19 Mayor Miyagishima said the legislature did move forward with requiring both.

20

21 He said I thought we had purchased a software so that we could target an area in the City where
22 there are utility outages.

23

24 David Dollahon said we'll check into it.

30 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said I appreciate the suggestion that Council members donate blood last
31 week.

33 He said I hope we can start a public dialogue or convene a task force about gun control to take a
34 different approach.

37 plaza. I do have some concerns about the plaza that need to be answered.

39 He said Friday I was included in the Juneteenth Banquet.

41 He said Saturday I was included in the Veteran's Appreciation Luncheon by El Caldito.

43 He said I know Verizon is looking at putting a cell tower at Locust and University. I hope that

1 consideration will be given to the architecture and being unobtrusive.
