21 Councillor Sorg Moved to Remove Resolution No. 17-011 from the table and Councillor
22 Levatino Seconded the motion.

26 Councillor Sorg Moved to allow the Mayor to attend the meeting via telephone and Councillor
27 Gandara Seconded the motion.
28

29 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith called for the roll on the Motion to allow the Mayor to attend the meeting
30 via telephone and it was Unanimously Approved. 7-0.
31

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33
34 Katherine Harrison-Rogers, Acting Building & Development Services Administrator presented
35 an overhead presentation.
36

37 Councillor Levatino asked do you have a cost for just chip seal?
38

39 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said it would be \$2800 that lasts up to five years.
40

41 Councillor Pedroza said it looks like the subject property is outside of the City limits.
42

43 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said the City limits wrap around the property.

2 Councillor Pedroza asked is the third person moving into that lot going to be driving a lot?
3
4 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said I can't say how much the person will drive but when staff looks
5 at this there's an average daily trip per single family home, which is typically 10 trips per day.
6
7 Councillor Pedroza asked will she be living alone?
8
9 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said that's personal information that we didn't delve into.
10
11 Daniel Avila, Interim City Manager asked Katherine, can you go over the cost for each options?
12
13 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said chip seal is \$2800, chip seal and micro surface \$6000, asphalt
14 millings and chip seal \$9500, and asphalt millings, chip seal, and micro surface \$12,500.
15
16 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith asked are we putting pressure on them to change?
17
18 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said they can continue how they are but the mother would like to put
19 her home on that location. They can subdivide, re-zone or do a variance.
20
21 Councillor Sorg asked will the neighbors across from the property be using the same road?
22
23 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said yes.
24
25 Councillor Sorg said I wish there was a way to share the cost between all five parcels.
26
27 Mayor Miyagishima asked would the applicant only be responsible for half the improvements?
28
29 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said the subdivision requires 100% of the road improvements. If it
30 was an arterial, then they would only be responsible for half, but you have the option to do a pro
31 rata share of improvements.
32
33 Mayor Miyagishima said it is an ordinance so we are going to have to require them to do some
34 sort of improvement.
35
36 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith asked is Stanley Road within the City limits more substantial.
37
38 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said it has some pavement but is not to City standard.
39
40 Councillor Pedroza asked what kind of condition is Steely Lane in?
41
42 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said staff didn't look at Steely Lane.
43
44 Mayor Pro-Tem Smith said Steely Lane is in the county.

1
2 Councillor Sorg said I would prefer splitting cost 50/50.
3
4 Councillor Levatino asked what are the other alternatives the Council can consider?
5
6 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said there's the full improvement with fee in lieu, alternate cross-
7 section and surfacing, and the no improvements. You could also take one of the alternate
8 surfacing and do a pro rata share with three lots.
9
10 Councillor Levatino asked would it be the same amount of surface completed?
11
12 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said the City would probably take a fee in lieu because it would be
13 challenging just to surface 10 feet. The City would keep the money until the time is right for
14 improvements.
15
16 Councillor Levatino asked would adding to tax bill every year be more painless?
17
18 Mayor Miyagishima said that was the Special Assessment District whereby we would work with
19 the County to apply a fee over 5-10 years.
20
21 David Weir, Community Development Director said it is easier to do a voluntary assessment
22 district in which the subdivider would be entering into a contract with the City to pay this over a
23 set period of time and then the City would have the ability to lien the property if the payments
24 weren't made.
25
26 Councillor Levatino asked would that need approval of the other land owners?
27
28 David Weir said it would be an agreement with the individual property owners.
29
30 Gerald Donohue, Surveyor said I'm representing Sylvia Cardon. This is her property and her
31 children have lived on it. We did discuss doing two lots and putting a variance on one but felt it
32 was a better approach to bring this into conformance.
33
34 Councillor Sorg asked does doing chip seal only still not comply with the code?
35
36 Katherine Harrison-Rogers said no, it does not.

40 Councillor Sorg Moved to Amend Resolution No. 17-011 to allow staff to do an agreement in
41 which the City would pay half and the subject property would pay over time. There was no
