David Dollahon, Interim City Manager said we opted for paying the County rather than doing a dual procurement. The County will own the system but we anticipate they will transfer the asset to MVRDA. The maintenance fees will be MVRDA's responsibilities. The system is also being worked on to integrate with Munis.

- 18 Councillor Pedroza asked how will this effect an ordinary citizen who needs the police?

- 20 Chief Jaime Montoya said right now we don't have encryption on our air time so the media will get
21 there first. So it will help public safety
22
- 23 Councillor Pedroza asked will there be benefit from increased capacity of system or is it for record
24 keeping?

- 26 Chief Jaime Montoya said it is more for record keeping.

- 28 Councillor Gandara asked will there be an integration with CYFD workers and children in danger?
