20 **III. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

22 Donna O’Daniel, Member of the Public said on August 19, 2016, the Las Cruces Support Your Local

38 because I could walk downtown. There is only a crosswalk at the post office and I want a crosswalk  
39 at Campo, Hadley and Griggs.

42 11, 2016. We are doing the poster contest again this year. We will recognize the winners at the  
43 October 17<sup>th</sup> Council meeting.

1 Glenn Schwaiger, Member of the Public said I've lived here 30 years and am an instructor at DACC.  
2 Last week I was given a proposal for the City to rent La Placita Mosaic to be fenced off for a new  
3 brew pub. It would restrict access to the park and mosaic. My concerns are private alcohol sales in  
4 a public park, the policy of leasing parks on a long term basis, and the fence will cover the art work.

6 Vince Jeffers, Member of the Public said there is money laundering going on. You need to take  
7 responsibility for what you're doing.

9 George Pearson, Member of the Public said any efforts toward reducing global warming is a good  
10 thing. I want to thank you for fixing the bump on Triviz Trail. I would like for us to continue with  
11 the bicycle path on Hadley as it will connect the east to the west side.

22 Councillor Levatino said I don't understand the City retaining a lien on the letter of credit.

23

24 Bob Cates, Deputy City Attorney said the original agreement had two sources of security, one was  
25 the lien against the building and one was a lien against the letter of credit, which was a better  
26 protection to ensure job creation.

27

28 Councillor Gandara asked what kind of positions will be created?

29

30 Bob Cates said they have seven positions under contract and three of them are physicians.

31

32 Virgil Medina, COO of La Clinica de Familia said a lot of the positions are medical. We're going  
33 to hire 150 new positions. Our plan is to have 24 hour emergency care access. We've hired three  
34 physicians and two dentists. We're going to have a residency program and will hire support staff.

35

36 Councillor Pedroza asked do you have an anticipated opening date?

37

38 Virgil Medina said we're projecting January 9, 2017. We're hoping for construction to be complete  
39 by November 15<sup>th</sup>.

40

41 Mayor Miyagishima asked are you taking out another loan?

42
